Functions: I administered comprehensive and brief neuropsychological and psychodiagnostic assessment batteries to both inpatients and outpatients. Inpatient referrals came from two adult psychiatry units, and covered a wide range of diagnoses including psychosis, personality disorders, mood disorders, malingering, and various cognitive/organic disorders. Outpatients were referred from in-house physicians and the community. These assessments were comprehensive, with diagnoses covering the spectrum of DSM-IV disorders. Cases were usually adult-oriented with occasional adolescent or pediatric evaluations. Other duties included providing feedback to outpatients and referring physicians, in addition to presenting inpatient assessment results to staff during daily grand rounds. I was also involved with administrative duties such as billing/insurance and supervising interns/practicum students on individual assessment cases. Didactics consisted of weekly assessment seminars and various electives offered through the medical center.

Brain injuries due to violence or motor vehicle accidents were the most common referral. I also served as a co-therapist for the hospital's outpatient traumatic brain injury (TBI) group. A rotation on the Comprehensive Rehabilitation Unit consisted of cognitive screenings and individual therapy with TBI, spinal cord injury (SCI), and general medical patients. While on this rotation, I had the opportunity to conduct a weekly SCI group and was an active participant in interdisciplinary patient staffings and family conferences. My final rotation was on the Infectious Disease Unit. I co-led an AIDS support group and conducted individual therapy in addition to personality assessments. Throughout the year, I maintained an outpatient therapy caseload of 4-5 patients who presented with a range of conditions including depression, anxiety, dissociative disorder, TBI, and chronic pain. I was also responsible for a skilled nursing care unit where I attended weekly staffings and responded to consultations (i.e., behavioral interventions, conflict resolution, staff education, etc.). Other activities included intellectual/adaptive functioning (MR) evaluations, didactics, presentations, and case conferences.

Present

Description: This study is examining the safety and efficacy of Modafinil (Provigil) for treatment of two key clinical outcomes in adult brain tumor patients. These include 1) fatigue and 2) neurobehavioral dysfunctions. Phase one of the trial (3 weeks) involves double-blinded randomization between two

dosage levels of Provigil (200 mg vs. 400 mg/day in divided doses). Following a one-week washout, an extended open label treatment phase is 8 weeks in duration. Measures include physical/neurologic examinations, fatigue questionnaires, cognitive tests, and a depression scale. This is the first study to assess the effects of Provigil in the adult brain tumor patient population. We will be seeking publication in the coming months now that data collection is complete.

These relatives are now reaching ages placing them at risk for the manifestation of AD. The primary manuscript was recently published.

Description: My study validated the "Neuropsychological Spectrum" theory with a population of adolescent offenders. This theory suggests that there is a continuum of psychological functioning ranging from biological to acquired traits. In addition, neuropsychological, intelligence, and achievement measures were employed to examine the effects of head injury and predict outcome in residential treatment centers.
